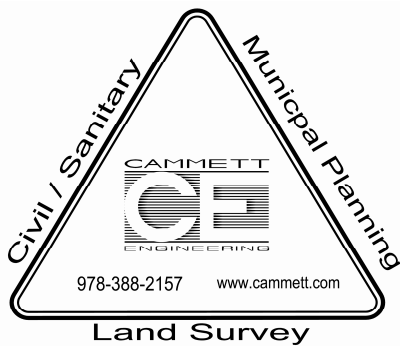

What is a Septic System

A septic system, sometimes called an on-site sanitary disposal system, is a two step treatment and disposal process of wastewater generated by your house.

The wastewater flows into the septic tank, the first step, where large solids are settled to the bottom and scum is floated on the surface. The liquid portion then ultimately goes to a final dispersion area where wastewater is percolated into the subsoil where it is purified prior to entering the groundwater.

Where is my Septic System

Any information on your septic system can be found at your local Board of Health office. These offices generally have past Title V inspections, permits, design plans, and as-built plans.

PROPER MAINTENANCE

- Keep this form handy and up to date with phone numbers and contacts.
- Have your septic tank pumped and inspected as needed and at least once every two years.
- Do not flush toxic materials such as paints, paint thinners, pesticides, chlorine, gasoline, or oils into the system.
- Do not flush non-biodegradable items such as diapers, sanitary pads, and plastics into the system.
- Repair leaking fixtures at once.
- Be conservative with water use and install water reducing fixtures where possible.
- Keep deep rooted trees and shrubs from growing in the area of your septic system.
- Keep heavy vehicles off the septic system.
- Eliminate the use of a garbage grinder/ disposal. These add increased loads of solids and scums that are harmful to the septic system.
